GROWING LITERACY SKILLS THROUGH UNITED READERS

We launched United Readers in the 2020-2021 school year and had a great first year of the program! We recruited five AmeriCorps mentors to build strong literacy skills in the children served across four schools in Washoe County through virtual one-on-one and small group instruction. In the 2021-2022 school year, we provided in-person services with ten AmeriCorps members in Washoe County at Dunn, Duncan, Peavine, Silver Lake, and Sun Valley Elementary Schools. At the end of 2021, we have served over 200 children and are well on our way to serving 250 students from kindergarten through third grade this school year.

LAUNCH OF THE NEVADA READY! STATE PRE-K PROGRAM

We partnered with the Nevada Department of Education and United Way of Southern Nevada to implement the Nevada Ready! State Pre-K program in our region to provide high-quality pre-k to children who otherwise would not have access. In 2021, we partnered with six private centers in Lyon County, Douglas County, Washoe County, and Carson City to provide funding for 65 qualified families to enroll their four-year-old children in high-quality pre-k experiences for free. "Partnering with United Way and the Nevada Ready! State Pre-K program here at Under the Magic Pine Tree has made a big impact in our center. We've been able to hire more staff that are more qualified and been able to increase how many children we can serve...Now we have families that are able to work for five hours a day and have free care for their child while their child is preparing for their elementary years."



READING COALITION LEADS ATTENDANCE CAMPAIGN

Through our leadership of the Northern Nevada Reading Coalition, we developed an attendance awareness campaign to raise awareness about the importance of attending school regularly. Missing even two days of school per month is considered chronic absenteeism and creates gaps in learning that can place children behind their peers. FUNDED PARTNERS

In October 2021, we wrapped up a one-year funding cycle with two partners. This grant was designed to focus on building early literacy and learning with particular consideration for the impacts of COVID-19. The Boys and Girls Club of Truckee Meadows was funded to develop critical skills in the staff in their four early learning centers, focusing on trauma-informed instruction and kindergarten readiness skills. A total of 471 children completed development assessments. After the grant, 96% of students were considered kindergarten ready, and five teachers received their Child Development Associate Credential, with an additional seven teachers in progress to completion. Our second partner, PBS Reno, adapted their Pre-K Ready To Learn Workshops to a virtual format—in total, completing 383 workshops with preschool children to get them ready for kindergarten.



ALIGNING EQUTIY THROUGH EQUTIY LEARNING COMMUNITY

Investing in building the capacity of our nonprofit community is an essential aspect of our vision for a thriving northern Nevada. In 2021, we launched the Equity Learning Community with 18 local nonprofits with the goal to create a foundation to improve social outcomes for a more equitable community during a 10month shared learning journey. During the meetings, representatives emphasized the value of the Equity Learning Community, the opportunity to build community with fellow nonprofits, and the structure and resources to help guide the internal equity work at their organization.

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CONTINUED RESPONSE TO COVID-19

We continued to respond to the impacts of COVID-19 on our community. Response efforts in 2021 included:

- Administration of federal funds through FEMA's Emergency Food and Shelter Program that were allocated for immediate basic needs like rental assistance, food, etc. in response to the pandemic
- Distribution of over 45,000 masks donated by the Department of Health and Human Services to nonprofits and neighbors in need throughout northern Nevada
- Continuation of the Delivering with Dignity program, which delivered 81,041 meals by over 250 United Way Food Hero volunteers in 13 months by partnering with 18 organizations to refer clients who were most in need and preserved 11 local restaurant jobs


